Description

On 29 August 2024, the Rothko Museum (Daugavpils, Latvia), hosted a public event to mark the completion of the ECADAE project's activities in Latvia. The event was attended by representatives from all project partner cities (Daugavpils, Latvia; Ignalina, Lithuania; Serock, Poland and Prachatice, Czechia). From the local public, the event brought together local residents, Latvian artists who had participated in the artist residencies organised by the project partners earlier this year, as well as other locally based artists, art students and art enthusiasts.

The event programme included the unveiling of an open-air poster exhibition featuring fragments of the artworks created during the project's artist residency in Daugavpils in July 2024. The posters were displayed in the windows of a heritage building in the Daugavpils Fortress, a stone's throw from the Rothko Museum, which will house the museum's extensive art collection after major renovations and adjustments to art storage needs in the upcoming years. There was also a discussion on equality in art, with a visit to an exhibition of paintings made during the artists' residency at the museum. Also during the event, everyone present participated in two creative workshops in metalwork and silkscreen printing. The motifs of a painting painted by one of the artists during the artists' residency could be silkscreened on a canvas bag. And enjoyed an open-air acoustic concert by local musicians Amanda Lapa-Slobožanina and Arnis Slobožanins. Songs about men and women, relationships and life.

The project partners summed up their project experience, shared insights and reflections and agreed they would like to cooperate in future projects.
